## Defining Education Terms

The ABC's are just the tip of the iceberg when it comes to educational abbreviations and acronyms. Parents, understandably, are often confused by all the terms used by schools and teachers. In the next few newsletters, we will take a quick look at some of the most common terms:

**RTI** (Response to Intervention) is a multi-tier approach to the early identification and support of students with learning and behavior needs. Students' progress is closely monitored at each stage of intervention to determine the need for another method of instruction and/or

intervention in both general and special education.

## WESTEST2 Assessment

Students in the third, fourth and fifth grades will be participating in the WESTEST2 Assessment beginning May 18<sup>th</sup>.

Please make sure your student gets plenty of rest and eats breakfast\* to be well prepared for his/her assessment. Please do not schedule appointments during your student's assessment. A parent guide will be sent home soon with more information. The following schedule will be utilized for assessments:

May 18<sup>th</sup>:

Reading/Language Arts

May 19<sup>th</sup>:

Math

May 20<sup>th</sup>:

Social Studies

May 21<sup>st</sup>:

Science

\*All students in grades 3-5 involved in testing will be provided a nutritious breakfast at school daily at no charge during the testing window.

## Illness Guidelines

The following list may be helpful when deciding whether or not to send a student to school.

1. Fever of 100 degrees or more.
2. Signs of respiratory illness (nasal discharge, cough, etc.)

3. Vomiting in the last 12 hours.
4. Undiagnosed rash or "open" skin lesion.
5. Untreated head lice and/or "nits" (lice eggs) in hair.
6. Chronic health problem.
